

Job Description - Counselor

Title: Clinical Counselor (Mental Health Provider)

Reports to: Clinical Supervisor

Summary: Counselors are responsible for providing a range of clinically appropriate services with emphasis on prevention. May help adults, children, families, couples or groups to promote optimum mental, emotional, relational, and spiritual health.

Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Provide a variety of treatment services including individual, group, family and marital therapy.
2. Provide clinical services such as intake/diagnostic evaluations and case evaluations.
3. Plans and evaluates individual service plans.
4. Be available to participate as part of an interdisciplinary treatment team.
5. Collaborate with other staff members to perform clinical assessments and develop treatment plans.
6. Participate in weekly scheduled group clinical supervision.
7. Maintain clinical records in accordance with established center policies and procedures.
8. Comply with best practice standards established by Clinical Supervisor or ELT.
9. Participate in weekly staff meetings.
10. Participate in the planning and/or the facilitation of least one training/workshop/seminar a semester.
11. Participate in at least one "retreat" structured event each semester.
11. Participate in at least one week of debriefing sessions with contracted schools per semester.
12. Participate in at least one member organization conference per semester.
13. Commit to growing in your field of counseling through continuing education each year and learning new developments in clinical counseling/psychology.
14. Provide requested services for training, consultations, and/or support services through "River of Life" to benefit the Thai population.

Knowledge and Skills Necessary:

1. Ability to provide clinically sound treatment services based on client needs and treatment plans.
2. Demonstrated understanding of diagnostic evaluation methods.
3. Ability to respond to a range of clients' needs.
4. Ability to maintain clinical records in timely compliance with center policies and procedures.
5. Ability to work collaboratively with other counselors and other community agencies on behalf of clients.
6. Demonstrated understanding of sound ethical practice as defined by one's training and discipline.
7. Ability to effectively organize time and responsibilities.

Qualifications:

1. Minimum of a Masters Degree in Social Work, Psychology, or related discipline from an accredited educational institution or equivalent.
2. Prefer at least two years of post-masters supervised clinical experience (in multidisciplinary mental health setting). Or (one year of supervised clinical work in an organized graduate internship program may be substituted for each year of full-time experience)
3. Willingness to work towards licensure if license eligible and if not already licensed.
